Your officers and management will make reports on the financial condition of the cooperative and activities past and future. Usually, the annual meeting is very educational for all who attend.

A delicious noon dinner is served by the Loyal American Legion Auxiliary, which in past years has been outstanding and enjoyed by everyone. Door prizes will be awarded and there will be a drawing for our annual tour to Dairyland Power Cooperative.

A great day is planned. Come join us and invite a neighbor or former member to join you. Former members cannot vote on any of the issues, but we are glad to see them back and have dinner with them.

Safety talks make a big impact

Clark Electric Cooperative going to area schools teaching electrical safety to students

Big Impressions! That's our goal when we go out to a local school and do our electrical safety demonstration. Going out to the local schools is something that Clark Electric Cooperative has done for many years, and it's time again. John Knox, director of member services, along with Kevin Sterland, lineman, have been doing safety demonstrations since Christmas. They have been going to area schools and delivering a very important message to everyone who sees the show. We go to schools that might have only 25 children to a school where more than 350 children watch the show. And what's best is that the show is geared towards

might come into contact with or play around. They show how many items demand respect around electricity. Such items are a kite string, a rope that may be used around the farm, ladders or antennas being put up, and trees, with the emphasis on making sure trees are kept clear of power lines. The show deals with how birds can sit on a wire and what happens when they get "grounded." John and Kevin also talk about downed wires and what not to do, while emphasizing what people should do. John and Kevin end up talking about home safety and things to be aware of, so if your child ends up coming home talking about an octopus in the house, you know where it came from—listen to them and get rid of it!

John and Kevin enjoy going out to the area schools teaching the importance of being safe around electricity, because across our county
