GETTING READY FOR WINTER

Simple Things Can Save You Money


Even though it might seem like winter is here, officially it's still a month away, with the really cold weather to come. However, it's not too late to think about preparing your home. You can use the following checklist to see how you can save energy and reduce your utility bills this winter.

- If you can control your own thermostat, do you set it no higher than 68 degrees during the day and no higher than 63 degrees during the night?
- Are your heat register openings dust free and unobstructed by furniture, draperies, or rugs?
- Do you keep draperies, shades, and blinds closed at night to retain heat in the home?
- Do you keep the draperies, shades, or blinds open on sunny days to let in heat from the sun?
- Have you installed weatherstripping around windows and doors to reduce drafts?
- Have you used plastic storm windows or other insulating treatment to prevent heat loss?
- Was your furnace or other heating equipment inspected by a service person before the start of the heating season?
- Do you change or clean your furnace filters monthly to improve efficiency and air quality?

If you answered yes to all these questions, chances are your home will be warm and cozy this winter while your energy usage will remain low.

You should caulk leaky windows, door frames, and other drafty areas to keep chilly air from seeping into your home. Weatherstrip all outside doors and windows, as well as interior doors that lead to unheated utility or storage areas. Insulate all exterior walls, the attic, floors over unheated areas, and around hot water heater and pumps.

There are also some easy ways to winterize your home. Seal off unused areas and reduce heat flow to them. Keep heating registers clean and be certain not to block them with furniture, draperies, or rugs. Close fireplace dampers when not in use. Open draperies, shades, or blinds on sunny days and close them at night. These measures will help lower your energy usage this winter and ensure your comfort. ■



CHECK YOUR CLOCKS

Save Money By Being On The Right Time

Do you have a time clock controlling your water heater or equipment that's programmed to go off because of our Time-of-Day rate? If you're on our Time-of-Day rate you most likely do. Since we are no longer on daylight savings time, you must make sure those clocks are also turned back.

It is important that you make these changes or you could end up having a higher than normal electric bill. Why? Because if you are on Time-of-Day, your hours for control (where the clock shuts the device off) are different than what we would be billing by the meter. So in essence, you would have two hours in the high-usage period.

Clark Electric Cooperative's Time-of-Day rate can save money on your electric bill; however, you must be willing and able to shift your electric usage around so that you can utilize the lower cost of electricity. ■
